Course Objectives:

The Professional Photography Diploma is designed to support aspiring and amateur photographers in developing the essential repertoire of skills and knowledge to start a successful career in photography. In six months, the course will comprehensively cover technical fundamentals, creative techniques, post-processing, and business aspects of the Indus- try. Participants will have extensive practice and hands-on experience under the guidance of instructors with impressive credentials and insights into various fields of photography.

By the end of the course, participants will have developed a professional portfolio, which will lead them to pursue their career pathway. More specifically, the course will encourage the participants to:

- ♦ Master the use of different camera settings, including aperture, shutter speed, and ISO, to achieve the desired exposure and creative effects in artificial and natural lighting conditions.
- ♦ Apply the principles of composition, such as the rule of thirds, leading lines, and framing, to create visually compelling and well-balanced photographs.



- ♦ Utilize various creative techniques, such as long exposure, shallow depth of field, and selective focus, to express artistic vision and evoke emotions in their photographs.
- Edit and enhance photographs using Adobe Photoshop and Lightroom to achieve professional-level results and maintain the integrity of the original image.
- Photograph a wide range of subjects, including portraits, landscapes, food, products, and events, with a strong understanding of each subject's unique requirements.
- Learn how to employ natural and artificial lighting effectively to create mood, highlight subject features, and control the overall atmosphere of the photograph.
- ♦ Pursue career opportunities in various sectors of photography, including freelance work, commercial photography, event coverage, and studio services.
- ♦ The week-wise distribution of sessions and their content is appended below.

Teaching and Learning Methodology

The course is designed in a way that will provide extensive experiential and hands-on practice opportunities for every participant. Interactive sessions where instructors and participants will be engaged in critiquing, analyzing, and understanding techniques, as depicted in their own work and that of master photographers, will form the core methodology.

Group and individual assignments, on-site and on-set practice and demo sessions, along with guest speaker sessions and participation in photow- alks, will also be organized to develop participants appreciation of the vast field of photography.



Assessment

While participants' progress will be gauged on a continuous basis, with instructors providing ongoing feedback for improvement, there will be a formal assessment of the course learning objective that will determine the successful completion of the diploma course and the awarding of a diploma certificate.

This entails:

- Online photo gallery or e-catalogue photography done in natural and artificial lighting (30% weightage)
- ♦ End of module presentation and jury (weightage 30%)
- ♦ Portofio exhibition at the end of the course (40% weightage, mandatory)

Instructors' Profile
